




# Signs of diabetes in the mouth

- Dry mouth
- Oral candidiasis
- Impaired wound healing
- Increase in dental caries
- Increase in periodontal disease
- Increase in saliva glucose level
- Gingival hyperplasia

## Why Diabetes & Dentistry is a two-way street?

 Diabetes is associated with higher risk of gum disease (periodontitis). With regular Dental visits person with Diabetes could decrease this risk

• When you care about your oral health it's more likely that you would achieve better glycaemic control


• Periodontitis in IDDM starts to appear after the age of 12 years (Deshmukh et. al 2011)

## What is periodontitis?



- It is a gum disease
- Chronic inflammatory disease that is triggered by bacterial microorganisms and involves chronic inflammation
- Inflammation causes the destruction of the tooth-supporting apparatus and could lead to tooth loss
- In periodontitis there is loss of the jawbone, periodontal ligament and root cementum



#### DURING DENTAL APPOINTMENT

- Remember that you are a part of a team
- Aim to arrange your visit in the morning
- ✓ Make sure to inform your dentist that you have diabetes (what Type, know your latest HbA1c)
- Before treatment check your BG, level and inform your dental team about your hypoglycemia signs
- ✓ Be prepared for hypo and always carry glucagon with you

**Dental appointment** 

✓ Dentist is going to check your oral health status and help with detection of caries, periodontal disease, assess salivary gland function

> ✓ It is essential to maintain good oral health hygiene.
>  Therefore remember rule

> > $2 \times 2$

2 times a day 2 minutes

 Please aim to brush your teeth after hypoglycaemia
 During the night.
 If you can't rinse your mouth with water.
